## Applications Must Include:

1. A signed cover letter that includes a statement explaining the applicant's interest in the program, eligibility criteria, length of the fellowship requested, preferred dates of the fellowship;
2. An abstract, not to exceed 300 words, that defines the topic of the proposed research and summarizes its objectives;
3. A research proposal, no more than six pages in length, that describes what is to be accomplished during the fellowship period; the status of the applicant's research on the proposed research topic; the specific relevance of the archives and collections chosen; the significance of the research to the advancement of an understanding and an appreciation of New Mexico History; and the expected results of the research;
4. A curriculum vitae, (no longer than four pages);
5. Copies of certified transcripts (students) or diplomas;
6. Two letters of recommendation. If the applicant is a graduate student enrolled in a Ph.D. program, one of the letters must be from the applicant's dissertation chair or advisor. If the applicant is enrolled in a master's degree program, one of the letters must be from the student's graduate advisor, and
7. Five collated copies of the application.
